Her research centers on developmental psychopathology, with a particular emphasis on emerging personality disorders in youth, the effects of childhood trauma, the development of mentalization, and adolescents' social network experiences. Since 2016, she has directed a research program in Lithuania that explores the development of personality pathology in young people and its links to psychosocial functioning. She has authored over thirty scientific publications. In addition to her academic work, Dr. Barkauskiene has been practicing as a psychotherapist for more than 20 years, specializing in adolescents, young adults, and families. She is also a teaching committee member and supervisor for Psychodynamic Therapy for Children and Adolescents program in Lithuania.
